ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL

COMPOSITION

The Legislative Committee shall be composed of the President, the President-Elect, and the Immediate Past President. Additional members of the General Assembly may be appointed by the President to serve on this committee. The President will appoint a Chair of this committee at the beginning of the President's term. The Chair may be any Voting Member of the Association including a BOD officer.

DUTIES

- 1. Create a long-range plan for legislative affairs and accept directives and recommendations from the Board of Directors and the General Assembly. The input received shall be incorporated into the Strategic Plan.
- 2. Ensure that the dental hygiene profession maintains its position as the principal licensed health care practitioner of dental hygiene services.
- 3. Prepare quarterly reports and an annual report of committee activities.
- 4. Assist Lobbyist in maintaining a presence at the State Capitol when appropriate.
- 5. Be familiar with key state legislators in leadership positions.
- 6. Be familiar with senate and house committees that may affect dental hygiene issues.
- 7. Have a working knowledge of the Indiana Practice Act and Administrative Rules.
- 8. Communicate with ADHA governmental affairs.
- 9. Orchestrate a legislative campaign (when appropriate) to include:
 - a) Activating the legislative communication network.
 - b) Preparing messages for member action.
 - c) Preparing/giving testimony at hearings.
 - d) Developing appropriate legislative messages for legislators.
 - e) Monitoring/proposing legislation.
- 10. Monitor/propose regulatory changes.
- 11. Report on legislative activities through IDHA communications (Quarterly Newsletter & website, email blasts, etc.).
- 12. Prepare messages for interaction with legislators.
- 13. Assist members in preparing messages to legislators.
- 14. Coordinate component Legislative Forums, if needed.
- 15. Solicit and mentor members who are interested in legislative activities.
- 16. Communicate with IDA, IDAA, and other health organizations when possible to create a collaborative effort when creating a legislative initiative.
- 17. Submit names of Legislators to the HI-PAC Committee who show support of IDHA Legislative Affairs. (Always seek input from the Lobbyist prior to submitting any names to the HI-PAC Committee.)
- 18. Be knowledgeable of the status of/changes in dental hygiene programs and the development of any new dental hygiene programs.
- 19. Consult with the IDHA Lobbyist to determine if an IDHA Lobby Day is appropriate each year. Present a proposed budget to the Finance Committee to determine financial viability. If funds are available, present a plan of action to the BOD for approval.
